The Structure to Follow

Title Page

Much like your actual thesis, the proposal needs to have its own title page which features the following information:

- The title of your project/research.
- Your name and the names of other project members, if any.
- The name of your supervisor.
- The name of your institute and/or department.

Abstract and Table of Contents

In the case of a long proposal, it helps if you have an abstract and a table of contents. Because that enables readers to quickly navigate through your proposal.

Introduction

This section of your proposal needs to pitch the idea of your project. You need to think like a student who has finally sat down to [WriteMyEssay](#). He starts off by coming up with an impressive hook for his work, which is exactly what you need to do here.

As such, your introduction needs to do the following things:

- Give an introduction to your research topic.
- Give relevant background information and context for your research.
- Mention your problem statement and the specific research question/s that you aim to answer.

Literature Review

Reference List

Each source used, needs to be properly cited and included in your reference list.

Schedule

Including this section might not be necessary most of the time. Nevertheless, you might need to give a schedule for your entire research.
